TOPIC- ART INTEGRATION

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The arts, also called fine arts are modes of expression that use skill or imagination in the creation of aesthetic objects, environments, or experiences that can be shared with others.

ART INTEGRATION

Arts integration is an approach to teaching in which students construct and demonstrate understanding through a form of the arts.

Art Integration uses teaching practices that have been shown in brain-based research to improve comprehension and long-term retention. Teachers don't need to be "artistic" to be able to use art integration; they just need to learn some of the fundamentals so they will be better able to think of ways to merge art concepts with other content.

Beyond engagement and retention, art integration encourages healthy risk taking, helps kids recognize new skills in themselves and others, provides a way to differentiate instruction, builds collaboration among both students and teachers, bridges differences, and draws in parents and the community.

IMPORTANCE OF ART INTEGRATION

- 1. Many students come to school and stay in school because of the arts.**
- 2. Children learn positive habits, behaviors and attitudes through the arts.**
- 3. The arts enhance creativity.**
- 4. The arts help students develop critical intellectual skills.**
