PROMOTION POLICY

For classes VI-VIII

- a) All the enrolled students who appear in both the terminal examinations(Mid Term and Annual) will be promoted to the next higher class under “ No Detention Policy” as per RTE Act 2009. For compilation of annual result, Mid Term and Annual will be taken together.
- b) If a student does not appear in all the subjects in both the terminal examinations, he/she will be placed in the category of “With held due to Long Absence”
- c) If a student appears in one or more subjects and remains absent in other subject(s) in any of the terminal examination, he/she will be provisionally promoted subject to the condition of “ To appear in the mid term or annual exam”
- d) If a student appears in all the subjects in the terminal examinations, he/she will be declared “Promoted/Pass”

Class IX

- a) For compilation of annual result, 20 marks of internal assessment, 30 marks of Half yearly exams and 50 marks of annual exam will be taken. It is compulsory for the student to obtain minimum 33 Marks out of 100 marks in each of the five main subject of study. The promotion is also subject to the condition that a minimum of 25% of marks should be secured in the annual examination i.e. out of 80 marks in each subject.
- b) A student who appears in the Annual Examination can be declared eligible for appearing at the Compartment Examination in not more than two failing subjects. Such a student shall be eligible to appear in the subject(s) at a subsequent examination to be held in April as "Compartment Examination".
- c) In order to be declared "Successful" in Compartment Examination, a student must secure at least 33% marks in the subject(s) in which he/she has taken the Compartment Examination.
- d) A student who is not eligible for Pass, Promotion or Compartment Examination either at the end of the session or for passing at the Compartment Examination, shall be declared "Fail" and detained in the same class during the next session.

Class X

Internal Assessment of 20 marks in each subject will be sent by the school to the Board. Board examination of 80 marks in each subject will be conducted by CBSE. Final result will be declared by CBSE. (20 Marks of internal assessment and 80 marks of Board Exams). It is compulsory for the student to obtain minimum 33 Marks out of 100 marks in each subject of study.

Class XI

- a) For compilation of annual result, 20% weightage of periodic test I and II, 30% of Half Yearly exam and 50 % of annual exam will be taken. It is compulsory to obtain minimum of 33% marks separately in theory and practical/ Project Work/ Assessment of Speaking & Listening Skills (ASL)/ Communicative Skills etc in each of the five main subjects excluding additional subject studied by him/her. The promotion is also subject to the condition that a minimum of 25% of marks should be secured in each subject in Annual Exam.

- b) A student who appears in the Annual Examination can be declared eligible for appearing at the Compartment Examination in one failing subject only. Such a student shall be eligible to appear in the subject at a subsequent examination to be held in April known as the "Compartment Examination."
- c) In order to be declared "passed" in the Compartment Examination, a student must secure at least 33% marks in the subject in which he/she has taken the compartment exam. The promotion is also subject to the condition that he/she secures 33% marks separately in Practical/ Project Work/ Assessment of Speaking & Listening Skills (ASL)/ Communicative Skills etc also.
- d) A student who is not eligible for a Pass, Promotion or Compartment Examination either at the end of the session or for passing at the Compartment Examination, shall be declared "Fail" and detained in the same class during the next session.

Class XII

Practical/Internal Assessment of 30/20 marks in each subject will be conducted. Annual Board Examination of 70/80 marks in each subject will be conducted by CBSE. It is compulsory to obtain minimum of 33% marks separately in theory and practical in each subject. Final Result will be declared by CBSE.
